Introduction



History

Meeteetse has a long history in Wyoming, starting with the formation of the post office in around 1883. It was formally incorporated as a town in 1901. Its history is represented by many of the buildings along the commercial core today including the first national bank built in 1901.

Study Area Background

The Town of Meeteetse, in partnership with the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT), is conducting a corridor study to address pedestrian connectivity throughout the commercial core. This project was initiated to address ADA accessibility and provide a plan to bring the corridor into conformance with state and federal standards.

Goals / Outcome

This plan will seek to understand the existing barriers to accessibility and connectivity through the downtown corridor, land use, vehicular and pedestrian traffic, natural constraints, and community preferences. Based on the findings of this review, multiple alternatives will be considered at the feasibility level and evaluated based on the communities objectives, practicality, and cost. Ultimately, one alternative will be further developed to a conceptual level as the recommendation. The findings of the study will be provided in a report.
